Ingredients & Prep Actions:

Serves 1	[Serves 2]	
200g	400g	Sweet Potato Chunks <i>cut into bite-sized pieces</i>
5ml	10ml	NOMU Spanish Rub
30g	60g	Peas
40g	80g	Salad Leaves <i>rinse & roughly shred</i>
20g	40g	Radish <i>rinse & slice into thin rounds</i>
50g	100g	Cucumber <i>rinse & slice into thin rounds</i>
20g	40g	Piquanté Peppers <i>drain</i>
50ml	100ml	Salad Dressing <i>(35ml [70ml] Apple Cider Vinegar, 10ml [20ml] Dijon Mustard & 5ml [10ml] Olive Oil)</i>
150g	300g	Beef Strips

From Your Kitchen

Oil (cooking, olive or coconut)
Seasoning (salt & pepper)
Water
Paper Towel

1. **SWEET ON SWEET POTATOES** Boil the kettle. Preheat the oven to 200°C. Spread the sweet potato on a roasting tray. Coat in oil, the NOMU rub, and season. Roast in the hot oven until golden, 25-30 minutes (shifting halfway). Alternatively, air fry at 200°C until crispy, 20-25 minutes (shifting halfway).

2. **PLUMP PEAS** Submerge the peas in boiling water until plump, 2-3 minutes. Drain and set aside.

3. **RADISH & PEPPER SALAD** To a salad bowl, add the salad leaves, the radish, the cucumber, and the peppers. Add the peas. Season and drizzle over the salad dressing. Toss until combined and set aside.

4. **BROWN THE BEEF STRIPS** Place a pan over high heat with a drizzle of oil. Pat the beef strips dry with paper towel. When hot, sear the beef until browned, 20-30 seconds (shifting occasionally). Remove from the pan and season.

5. **ALMOST THERE** When the potato is done, toss through the dressed salad.

6. **TIME TO NOSH** Plate up the loaded sweet potato & fresh salad and top with the browned beef.
