Cape Malay Dahl

with homemade raita, toasted pistachios & rotis

Our take on this dahl is a nod to the Cape Malay cuisine. It is given an edge by cool raita, a pistachio crunch, bright spinach, and toasted chickpeas tumbled with plump sultanas.

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Ingredients & Prep

120g	Chickpeas <i>drained & rinsed</i>
20g	Golden Sultanas
30ml	Spice & All Things Nice Cape Malay Curry Paste
200g	Red Lentils <i>rinsed</i>
200g	Cooked Chopped Tomato
150g	Spinach <i>rinsed & roughly shredded</i>
100g	Cucumber <i>rinsed & grated</i>
200ml	Greek Yoghurt
5g	Fresh Coriander <i>rinsed, picked & finely chopped</i>
10g	Pistachio Nuts
4	Rotis

From Your Kitchen

Oil (cooking, olive or coconut)
Salt & Pepper
Water
Sugar/Sweetener/Honey
Butter (optional)

1. A PAN OF GOLDEN DELIGHT Place a pan over medium-high heat with a drizzle of oil. When hot, toast the drained chickpeas until crispy and caramel in colour, 12-15 minutes (shifting occasionally). If they start to pop out, use a lid to rein them in. During the final 2 minutes, add the sultanas and a knob of butter (optional). Remove from the pan, cover, and set aside.

2. GET YOUR DAHL STARTED Place a pot over medium heat with a drizzle of oil. When hot, fry the curry paste (to taste) until fragrant, 1-2 minutes (shifting constantly). Add the rinsed lentils, the cooked chopped tomato, and 350ml of water. Stir until the curry paste is incorporated into the liquid and bring to a boil. Once boiling, reduce the heat and simmer until the lentils are cooked through and the sauce is thick, 10-12 minutes. Stir through the shredded spinach and cook until wilted, 3-4 minutes. Loosen with a splash of water if it's too thick.

3. WHILE THE CURRY IS SIMMERING... Using a clean cloth, squeeze out and discard the liquid from the grated cucumber. Combine the strained cucumber with $\frac{1}{3}$ of the yoghurt and $\frac{3}{4}$ of the chopped coriander. Season and set aside. Place the pistachios in a clean pan over medium heat. Toast until golden brown, 2-3 minutes (shifting occasionally). Remove from the pan and roughly chop.

4. ROTI O'CLOCK Return the pan to medium heat. When hot, toast each roti until warmed through, 30-60 seconds per side. Alternatively, spread them out on a plate in a single layer and heat up in the microwave, 30-60 seconds.

5. ALMOST THERE! Once the dahl is cooked and the spinach is wilted, remove from the heat and stir through the remaining yoghurt. Add a sweetener and season.

6. TIME TO DEVOUR Spoon the silky Cape Malay dahl into bowls and top with the chickpeas & sultanas. Garnish with the toasted pistachios and the remaining coriander. Serve with the raita and rotis on the side. Scoop up and enjoy!
