Ingredients & Prep Actions:

40g	80g	Soba Noodles
125g	250g	Button Mushrooms wipe clean & cut into quarters
1	1	Onion peel & roughly dice ½ [1]
15g	30g	Fresh Ginger peel & grate
150g	300g	Free-range Ostrich Minc
5ml	10ml	Gochujang
5ml	10ml	Tomato Paste
15ml	30ml	Low Sodium Soy Sauce
20g	40g	Spinach

rinse

Fresh Coriander

rinse, pick & roughly chop

Cooking Spray

Seasoning (salt & pepper) Water Paper Towel

1. OODLES OF NOODLES Bring a pot of salted water to boil for the noodles. Cook the noodles until al dente, 3-4 minutes. Drain, reserving a cup of noodle water, and rinse in cold water.

MMMUSHROOMS Return the pan to medium-high heat. When hot, add the mushrooms and lightly
coat in cooking spray. Fry until golden, 5-6 minutes (shifting occasionally). Remove from the pan and
season.

3. MOUTHWATERING MINCE Return the pan to medium-high heat. When hot, add the onion and lightly coat with cooking spray. Fry until browned and softened, 5-6 minutes. Add the ginger and fry until fragrant, 30-60 seconds (shifting constantly). Add the mince and work quickly to break it up as it starts to cook. Fry until browned, 4-5 minutes (shifting occasionally).

4. GO-GO-GOCHUJANG Add the gochujang (to taste), the tomato paste, the soy sauce, the spinach, the noodles and mushrooms. Simmer until the leaves are wilted, 1-2 minutes (shifting occasionally). Remove from heat, loosen with the reserved water, add seasoning and set aside.

5. SENSATIONAL SUPPER Dish up the silky soba noodles and mushrooms and spoon over the saucy Asian veggies and ostrich. Sprinkle over the coriander. Beautiful, Chef!

Chef's Tip Mushrooms release water when they cook, so if there are too many in the pan, they could boil instead of caramelise!
