## Ingredients & Prep Actions:

Serves 3	[Serves 4]	
300ml	400ml	Jasmine Rice <i>rinse</i>
450g	600g	Free-range Ostrich Chunks
300g	400g	Baby Marrow Rounds
150g	150g	Sliced Onions
2	2	Garlic Cloves <i>peel &amp; grate</i>
60ml	80ml	Red Curry Paste
300ml	400ml	Coconut Cream
150g	200g	Peas
120g	160g	Green Leaves <i>rinse</i>
90g	120g	Piquanté Peppers <i>drain</i>
2	2	Limes <i>rinse &amp; cut into wedges</i>

## From Your Kitchen

Oil (cooking, olive or coconut)  
Seasoning (salt & pepper)  
Water  
Sugar/Sweetener/Honey  
Paper Towel

1. **RICE** Place the rice in a pot with 600ml [800ml] of salted water. Cover with a lid and bring to a boil. Reduce the heat and simmer until the water has been absorbed, about 10 minutes. Remove from the heat and set aside to steam, 8-10 minutes. Fluff with a fork and cover.

2. **OSTRICH** Place a pan over medium-high heat with a drizzle of oil. Pat the ostrich dry with paper towel and cut into small pieces. When hot, sear the ostrich until browned, 1-2 minutes (shifting occasionally). Remove from the pan. Return the pan to medium heat with all the pan juices. Fry the baby marrow until lightly charred, 2-3 minutes (shifting occasionally). Remove from the pan.

3. **COCONUT OSTRICH CURRY** Return the pan to medium heat with a drizzle of oil if necessary. Fry the onion until soft, 3-4 minutes. Add the garlic and the curry paste. Fry until fragrant, 1-2 minutes. Mix in the coconut cream, 150ml [200ml] of water, and the peas. Simmer until slightly reduced, 8-10 minutes. In the final 1-2 minutes, mix in the spinach, the baby marrow, the ostrich, a sweetener (to taste), and seasoning.

4. **DINNER IS READY** Bowl up the rice, top with the ostrich curry, and scatter over the piquanté peppers. Finish with a squeeze of lime juice (to taste) and dig in, Chef!
