Mexican-style Ostrich Mince Fiesta

with diced avocado & corn nachos

You're not going to wanna share this plate of nachos, Chef! Free-range ostrich mince is smothered in Mexican spices & tomato sauce. Poured over a pile of crunchy corn nachos, then topped with homemade cheese sauce, avocado cubes, and a baby tomato & pickled jalapeño salsa.

Ingredients & Prep	
300g	Free-range Ostrich Mince
1	Onion peeled & finely diced
20ml	Mexican Spice
200ml	Cooked Chopped Tomato
20ml	Cornflour
250ml	Low Fat Fresh Milk
100g	Cheddar Cheese grated
1	Avocado
160g	Baby Tomatoes rinsed & roughly chopped
30g	Sliced Pickled Jalapeños drained & roughly chopped
5g	Fresh Coriander rinsed, picked & finely chopped
160g	Corn Nachos
From Your Kitchen	
Oil (cooking, olive or coconut) Salt & Pepper	

1. FRY THE OSTRICH MINCE Place a pan over medium-high heat with a drizzle of oil. When hot, fry the mince and work quickly to break it up as it starts to cook. Fry until browned, 4-5 minutes (shifting occasionally). 2. ADD SOME TOMATO Add 34 of the diced onion and fry until soft, 3-4 minutes. Add the Mexican spice and fry until fragrant, 1-2 minutes. Pour in the cooked chopped tomato and 300ml of water. Simmer until reduced and thickened, 12-15 minutes. Add a sweetener and seasoning. Remove from the heat.

- 3. CHEESE SAUCE Place a small pot over medium heat with 20g of butter. Once melted, vigorously mix in the cornflour to form the roux. Cook out the flour, 1-2 minutes (stirring constantly). Slowly whisk in the milk, stirring continuously to prevent lumps. Once the milk is incorporated, mix in the grated cheese until melted. Season and remove from the heat. Add a splash of water or milk (from your kitchen) if the
- 4. SALSA STEP Halve the avocado and remove the pip. Peel off the avocado skin. Roughly dice and season. Set aside. In a small bowl, combine the chopped tomatoes, the chopped jalapeño (to taste), the remaining onions (to taste), the chopped coriander, and seasoning.

sauce is too thick.

5. TIME TO FEAST Make a bed of the nachos or serve on the side for dunking. Lay down the saucy ostrich mince, drizzle over the cheese sauce, and scatter over the avocado and the tomato salsa. Well done, Chef!
